# FROM THE PRINCIPAL ... Twenty-First Century Technology for Hanwood

This year our school has had a major technology update, with combined funding from the Department's Rural Access GAP Program and school funds. We have 30 new student laptops, 11 new teacher laptops and 5 new laptops for executive staff. We also have a new desk-top computer for the Library.

We have changed the way we charge and store our new laptop computers. We have a 'Computers on Wheels' (COWS) cupboard where 32 laptops can be stored whilst charging, in a locked cupboard that is on wheels. This cupboard can be moved to classes for use or be used in our Technology Centre. We also have two new laptop charging shelves (see photo below).

Many thanks to our two technology support teachers, Jenny Workman and Simone Amaro, who have managed

to get all our new devices and systems set up for our school.
