FROM THE PRINCIPAL ~ Leadership & Well-being Program for Students in Years 1 to 6

Next week students will be participating in a new program we are developing. The program will have a focus on both *student well-being* and *leadership*. We will be looking at the qualities of leadership including communication, values, and empathy. The program will also provide the opportunity to focus on transitions from infants to primary, Stage 2 to Stage 3 and Year 6 to high school.



Year 6 students will

be working with Mrs de Peralta with a focus on transition to Year 7 and developing strategies of resilience, responsibility, decision making, organisation and empathy.

Year 4 and Year 5 students will be grouped into boys' and girls' grouping. The Year 4/5 boys' group will work with Mr Young and Mrs Callinan, and the Year 4/5 girls will be working with Mrs Castellaro, Mrs Mackerras and Mrs Makepeace. The 4/5 groups will focus on leadership for 2023 as well as student well-being.

Students in Year 2 and Year 3 will be working with Miss Signor, Mrs Ceccato and Miss Dotta. The focus will be on Stage 2 responsibilities and student well-being.

Year 1 students will be working with Miss Amaro and their focus will be on student well-being, with an emphasis on its '*cool to be kind*'.



The well-being focus for students will be to develop supportive friendships and empathy, recognising bullying behaviours, including exclusion, and respectful behaviour. We will discuss and role play strategies students can use in our school when faced with a bullying situation.
