
Premier's Back to School Vouchers can be used to purchase school uniforms at Hanwood PS Uniform shop...

The Premier's Back to School NSW program is offering parents and carers \$150 worth of vouchers (3 x \$50 vouchers) to help pay for school supplies such as school uniforms, shoes, bags, textbooks and stationery.

Every student in a NSW public school is eligible for the vouchers.

The NSW Department of Education is working with Service NSW to streamline the administration process for schools to accept the vouchers as a payment before the start of Term 1 2023.

The vouchers program will be effective from 1 January 2023 to 30 June 2023.

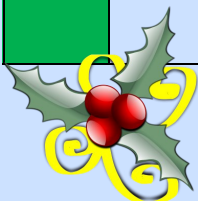
